NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Madison express full confidence in the City of Madison's election officials and Wisconsin's system of nonpartisan election administration led by the Wisconsin Election Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Common Council directs staff to implement any additional necessary security measures for the City Clerk's Office and staff to ensure the safe conduct of elections and other City business; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Common Council calls on all elected officials, candidates and political parties, as well as other organizations and individuals to cease all attempts to undermine confidence in election officials and election results and attempts to harass, intimidate or threaten election officials, including but not limited to the City Clerk, staff of the Clerk's Office, and elections inspectors who work at the polls.
